



Prostate cancer in Luxembourg

Testicular cancer:
rare but number 1 cancer
in young men

In 2022, prostate cancer accounted for 29.3% of all male cancers, with 443 new cases diagnosed.

It is the most common cancer among men in Luxembourg.

On average, around 20 men are diagnosed with testicular cancer each year in Luxembourg. This cancer has very high cure rates when detected early.

- Difficulty urinating •
- Frequent urge to urinate, especially at night
- Blood in the urine or semen •

These symptoms may be warning signs of prostate cancer.

- · A lump or swelling in one testicle
- A change in weight or size of one testicle
- A discomfort or feeling of heaviness in the scrotum

These symptoms, which can often be detected through self-examination, may be signs of testicular cancer.

Prostate cancer shows no symptoms in its early stages.

True. In its early stages, prostate cancer is often asymptomatic, which is why screening is important for early detection.

A PSA blood test can always detect prostate cancer.

(PSA (Prostate-Specific Antigen) can indicate a potential risk of prostate cancer, but it is not enough on its own to make a reliable diagnosis. High PSA levels can be caused by other conditions, and low PSA levels do not necessarily rule out cancer.

Additional tests are needed alongside the PSA test to confirm any risk of cancer.

Testicular cancer mainly affects men over 50.
